hong kong boasts a number of rich archaeological sites behind sandy bays among these backbeaches is sha po on lamma island a site which has long captured the attention of archaeologists however until now no comprehensive study of the area has ever been published piecing together sha po presents the first sustained analysis framed in terms of a multi period social landscape of the varieties of human activity in sha po spanning more than 6 000 years synthesising decades of earlier fieldwork together with atha and yip s own extensive excavations conducted in 2008 2010 the discoveries collectively enabled the authors to reconstruct the society in sha po in different historical periods the artefacts unearthed from the site some of them unique to the region reveal a vibrant past which saw the inhabitants of sha po interacting with the environment in diverse ways evidence showing the mastery of quartz ornament manufacture and metallurgy in the bronze age suggests increasing craft specialisation and the rise of a more complex competitive society later on during the six dynasties tang period sha po turned into a centre in the region s imperially controlled kiln based salt industry closer to our time in the nineteenth century the farming and fishing communities in sha po became important suppliers of food and fuel to urban hong kong ultimately this ground breaking work tells a compelling story about human beings ceaseless reinvention of their lives through the lens of one special archaeological site a singular effort in the field of hong kong archaeology piecing together sha po adopts a social landscape approach to chart the development of a single site over millennia of occupation revealing as it does the untapped potential which careful field investigations hold for generating a better understanding of the region s rich past francis allard department of anthropology indiana university of pennsylvania this volume is the best overview of the early history of hong kong that i know the authors have articulated patterns of human settlement at sha po in a masterly way that informs us not only of lamma island or greater hong kong but of lingnan as a whole i welcome it as the key source for specialists and the interested public alike charles higham department of anthropology and archaeology university of otago new zealand it is rare indeed for a multi period study of a

palaeolithic societies have been a neglected topic in the discussion of human origins in this book which succeeds and replaces the palaeolithic settlement of europe published by cambridge university press in 1986 clive gamble challenges the established view that the social life of europeans over the 500 000 years of the european palaeolithic must remain a mystery in the past forty years archaeologists have recovered a wealth of information from sites throughout the continent professor gamble now introduces a new approach to this material he examines the archaeological evidence from stone tools hunting and campsites for information on the scale of social interaction and the forms of social life taking a pan european view of the archaeological evidence he reconstructs ancient human societies and introduces new perspectives on the unique social experience of human beings

the routledge handbook of henri lefebvre the city and urban society is the first edited book to focus on lefebvre s urban theories and ideas from a global perspective making use of recent theoretical and empirical developments with contributions from eminent as well as emergent global scholars the book provides international comparison of lefebvrian research and theoretical conjecture and aims to engage with and critique lefebvre s ideas in the context of contemporary urban social and environmental upheavals to use lefebvre s spatial triad as a research tool as well as a point of departure for the adoption of ideas such as differential space to reassess lefebvre s ideas in relation to nature and global environmental sustainability and to highlight how a lefebvrian approach might assist in mobilising resistance to the excesses of globalised neoliberal urbanism the volume draws inspiration from lefebvre s key texts the production of space critique of everyday life and the urban revolution and includes a comprehensive introduction and concluding chapter by the editors the conclusions highlight implications in relation to increasing spatial inequalities increasing diversity of needs including those of migrants more authoritarian approaches and asymmetries of

access to urban space above all the book illustrates the continuing relevance of lefebvre s ideas for contemporary urban issues and shows via global case studies how resistance to spatial domination by powerful interests might be achieved the handbook helps the reader navigate the complex terrain of spatial research inspired by lefebvre in particular the handbook focuses on the series of struggles globally for the right to the city and the collision of debates around the urban age cityism and planetary urbanisation it will be a guide for graduate and advanced undergraduate teaching and a key reference for academics in the fields of human geography sociology political science applied philosophy planning urban theory and urban studies practitioners and activists in the field will also find the book of relevance

observers while others actively care for their environment the remaining three articles deal with teaching methods and models benninghaus et al present a benchmark method which allows statements about the quality of the maps diagrams in general lvarez otero and de l zaro y torres on the other hand describe their technological pedagogical content knowledge model kopnina and saari discusses student assignments reflecting on the documentary film through critical pedagogy and ecopedagogy
